## **Sacramento City Unified reduces summer school offerings due to ongoing state budget crisis**

The Sacramento City Unified School District Board of Education voted Thursday evening to reduce summer school offerings because of additional state budget cuts to education. Approximately 5,500 K-8 students will be affected. District officials expect to save approximately \$1.9 million.

Closed programs will include regular elementary summer classes in kindergarten through sixth grade at the following locations: A.M. Winn, Caroline Wenzel, Clayton B. Wire, Elder Creek, Ethel I. Baker, Ethel Phillips, Freeport, Hubert Bancroft, John Bidwell, Joseph Bonnheim, Pacific morning program, Sequoia, William Land and Woodbine.

Also closed were regular middle school summer classes to be conducted at high school campuses. Affected are would-be summer school students from Albert Einstein, Caleb Greenwood, California, Fern Bacon, Genevieve Didion, John Morse, John Still, Kit Carson, Leonardo daVinci, Martin Luther King, Jr., Rosa Parks, Sutter and Will C. Wood.

Adult Education Classes to be closed are General Education Diploma (GED), English as a Second Language (ESL), Adult Basic Education (ABE), Older Adults, and Distance Learning. The Career Technical Education (CTE) program will continue with increased registration costs.

Elementary programs not affected are the Culturally/Linguistically Responsive Program (CLRP) at Edward Kemble and Father Keith B. Kenny scheduled June 29 to July 31 from 9 a.m. to 1 p.m. The Hmong/Mien/Lao afternoon program at Pacific Elementary (June 29 - July 31) conducted from 1 p.m. to 4:30 p.m. will also continue.

All comprehensive high schools, C. K. McClatchy, Hiram Johnson, John F. Kennedy, Luther Burbank, Rosemont, and Capital City Independent Studies will continue to serve students in Grades 9 - 12 who have met the eligibility requirements (have failed the California High School Exit Exam or lack required credits for graduation) from June 22 -July 31.

Also not affected is the Refugee Student Assistance Program (RSAP) for students in Grades 7 -12 located at Luther Burbank, Hiram Johnson, and John F. Kennedy high schools. Classes are scheduled from 8 a.m. to 3 p.m., beginning June 22 and ending July 31. In addition, the Mathematics/English Language Arts Academy at California State University, Sacramento will remain open. Fremont Adult High School will continue to serve concurrently enrolled high school students from July 1 thru Aug. 14.

Special Education K-6 students eligible for Extended School Year (ESY) programs will attend either Joseph Bonnheim or Caroline Wenzel. Bowling Green and Marian Anderson Special Education ESY programs will also remain open. Special education ESY students in Grades 7-12 will attend either Luther Burbank or Rosemont High Schools.
